Ideas	Each paragraph and element is detailed and descriptive. The details provided are in the author's own words.	Some paragraphs and elements are detailed and/or descriptive. The author uses his or her own words most of the time.	There is little or no description for each paragraph or element. The details may not be in the author's own words. Organization	The report is organized into 5 paragraphs and includes all 5 of the required elements.	The report is organized into 2-4 paragraphs, and some of the 5 required elements are present.	The report is not organized into paragraphs, and few of the 5 required elements are present.	The report has more than 5 paragraphs to explain the 5 required elements, and paragraphs begin and end in correct places.
Style/Voice	The author writes the report in first person, and it sounds like a conversation between the character and the reader.	The author writes the report in first person, but it doesn't always flow like a conversation between the character and the reader.	The author does not write the report in first person, and it does not flow like a conversation.	The author not only writes the report in first person, and makes it sound like a smooth conversation, but also adds voice that makes the character come alive.
Conventions	Spelling, punctuation and grammar are almost always correct. There is no interference with the reader's understanding of the report.	Spelling, punctuation and grammar are sometimes correct. There may be a few times when there is interference with the reader's understanding of the report.	Spelling, punctuation and grammar are often incorrect, and interfere with the reader's understanding of the report.	Spelling, punctuation and grammar are all correct and are used to enhance the report.
